Eminent Agricultural Economists, Teachers, Scientists, Policy planners, and Government officials from State, National, and International organizations are expected to participate in the conference.

ABOUT INDIAN SOCIETY OF AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS (ISAE)

The ISAE was established in December 1939 under the Societies Registration Act of 1860 and the Bombay Public Trusts Act of 1950. The society's objectives are to promote the study of social and economic problems of agriculture in rural areas and to promote technical competence for teaching and research in agricultural economics and allied subjects.

ABOUT THE INSTITUTE

Chaudhary Charan Singh Haryana Agricultural University (An A+ Accredited University by National Agricultural Education Accreditation Board, ICAR, New Delhi) located at Hisar in the Indian state of Haryana, named after India's seventh Prime Minister Chaudhary Charan Singh, is one of the biggest agricultural universities in Asia that has made a special niche at the global level. The University alongwith contributes significantly towards achieving nutritional security, sustainability, and wellness and is open to new partnerships in research, teaching, and extension.

Presently the University has four faculties and within these faculties there are six constituent colleges: College of Agriculture [(Hisar (1962); Kaul (1974) and Bawal (2016)], College of Basic Sciences & Humanities (1970), Indira Chakravorty College of Home Sciences (1973) renamed as Indira Chakravorty College of Community Sciences (2023), College of Agricultural Engineering & Technology (1992) and College of Fisheries Science (2019), College of Biotechnology (2022) while Institute of Business Management and Agripreneurship, Gurugram is under construction. However, classes have been started at CCSHAU main campus, Hisar. The University also houses a training institute for skill development.

The University is a leader in agricultural research and in developing new technologies like conservation agriculture, direct seeded rice, and herbicide resistance management for overall improvement in the crop productivity of the state. With the evolution of 305 varieties of various crops, including cereals, pulses, oilseeds, cotton and sugarcane crops, vegetables, and fruit crops, CCSHAU has been constantly upgrading itself by embracing new technologies and entering partnerships with premier national and international institutions. 27 Patents, 17 Copyrights, 17 Designs, 1 Trademark and 655 MoUs/agreements have been signed to collaborate with national industries/institutes and international institutes in the USA, UK, Australia, Czech Republic, Poland, New Zealand, Philippines, Kazakhstan, and Tanzania to pave the way for scientific and academic excellence.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Economics was started in 1962 with the establishment of the Hisar Campus of the erstwhile Punjab Agricultural University. It became a full-fledged department in 1970 with the formation of Haryana Agricultural University. The department is engaged in the three core activities of teaching, research, and extension as part of an integrated system of education in the university. The department has achieved many distinctions in various academic activities. Prestigious distinctions like the Dr. Rajendra Prasad Award for writing the university level textbook in Hindi language, Jawaharlal Nehru Award for outstanding post-graduate agricultural research, Young Teacher Award, two Best Teachers Awards, and Professor of Emeritus have been bagged by the scientists of this department. So far, 10 Books, 78 Technical Research Bulletins, 30 Extension Bulletins, 12 Teaching manuals, and 26 other reports have been published by department faculty members in addition to their valuable contributions of research papers/articles, etc., in various journals of national and international repute.

The department is implementing the Comprehensive Scheme for Studying the Cost of Cultivation of Principal Crops in India-Haryana with a sanctioned strength of 41 employees funded by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India, New Delhi Since 1970 to provide quality data for fixation of MSP of principal crops. The economics of principal crops cultivated in the Kharif and Rabi seasons were also worked out by the faculty of the department and presented in the Agricultural Officers Workshop (AoW) for Kharif and Rabi each year.

The teaching programme of the department includes instructions at the U.G. level for B.Sc.(Hons.) Agriculture and B.Sc. (Hons.) Agribusiness Management students of COA, B.Sc. (Community Science), students of I.C. College of Community Science (COCS), College of Fisheries Science COAE&T and PG level students of COA, ICCOCS, and COBS&H. The present intake of students at the M.Sc. level is 10, and at the Ph.D. level is 6. Since the inception of the department in 1969, 257 M.Sc. and 91 Ph.D. students have completed their degrees in the discipline of Agricultural Economics.

ABOUT THE HISAR

Once known as Hisar-e-Firoza by its founder ruler Firoz Shah Tughlaq, in 1354 AD, the city has several historical buildings such as fort, palaces, tombs, mosques, gates, and gardens. Some of the monuments are still in a good state of preservation. It is situated 180 km west of the National Capital, Delhi, at NH 09 in the state of Haryana, and it is well connected by rail/road with all the nearby major cities. The nearest airport is Indira Gandhi International Airport, New Delhi. Several educational institutions, including reputed universities like CCS Haryana Agricultural University, Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, and LalaLajpat Rai University of Veterinary & Animal Sciences are established in Hisar apart from ICAR institutes like CIRB, NRC Equines and Northern Region Farm Machinery Training & Testing Institute. Around Hisar city, the ancient site of Rakhigarhi, one of the five known biggest townships of Harappan civilization on the Indian subcontinent, and the ancient site of Agroha, traditionally believed to be the Capital of the legendry king Maharaja Agrasena can be visited. The favourable Government policies have played a vital role in the city's economic development. The government's industrial policy has attracted many entrepreneurs, and presently, it is also known as the Steel City of Haryana.



HOW TO REACH TO HISAR?

Hisar is well connected with the rest of the country through air, rail, and road.

AIR	TRAIN	BUS
The nearest international airport is Indira Gandhi International Airport (DEL) in New Delhi, approximately 162 km away. You can hire a taxi or take a bus from the airport to reach Hisar. Hisar also has its own airport, Maharaja Agrasen International Airport (HSS), which was recently upgraded. As of May 2025, Alliance Air operates direct flights both ways from Hisar to Delhi and Ayodhya. The airport is located about 5 km northeast of the city center.	Hisar Junction Railway Station (Station Code: HSR) is a major railway junction well-connected to major cities across India through the Indian Railways network. Regular trains are available from Delhi, Mumbai, Jaipur, Gorakhpur, Amritsar, Secunderabad, Coimbatore, and many other cities.	Hisar is well connected by a network of national and state highways. The city has a major bus terminal, and you can find regular bus services operated by government and private agencies from nearby cities like Delhi, Chandigarh, Jaipur, and other major towns in Haryana and neighbouring states. Buses to Hisar are readily available from the Inter-State Bus Terminus (ISBT) in New Delhi.

CLIMATE

For the 85th Annual Conference scheduled from November 11-13, 2025, in Hisar, you can expect pleasant weather with warm days (20°C to 28°C) and cool nights (14°C to 17°C). The probability of rain is low, and you can look forward to mostly sunny days. Light winter clothing might be advisable for the evenings and early mornings when the temperature can drop.

AWARDS TO BE GIVEN BY SOCIETY IN CONFERENCE

1. BEST Ph.D. PRESENTATION'

Three best Ph.D. presentation awards will be given to the Ph.D. scholars from different Universities/Colleges to showcase their research. It is mandatory for Ph.D. Scholars who present their papers to be a member of the Society. The Ph.D. scholars can submit a one-page abstract based on their Ph.D. research or any relevant topic pertaining to Agricultural Economics.

2. DR. S.R. SEN PRIZE AWARD FOR THE BEST BOOK ON AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT

The Indian Society of Agricultural Economics invites entries for the biennial Dr. S.R. Sen Prize Award (Rs. 15,000/-) for the best book/monograph in Agricultural Economics and Rural Development by Indian authors under 45 years of age. Works must offer original theoretical or empirical insights. Edited books are not eligible. Only books/monographs published during 2023 and 2024 will be considered.

3. PROFESSOR R.C. AGRAWAL PRIZE ENDOWMENT AWARD

Instituted in 2004, this biennial award (Rs. 25,000/- and citation) honors Indian scholars for significant contributions to Agricultural Economics. The 9th awardee will be honored during the 85th ISAE Annual Conference at CCSHAU, Hisar Nov 11–13, 2025. Nominations (one per person) with a resume should be submitted.

4. PROFESSOR S.S. JOHL AWARD FOR THE BEST PH.D. THESIS

The Professor S.S. Johl Award recognizes outstanding Ph.D. research in Agricultural Policy and allied sectors. Open to scholars who obtained their degree/provisional certificate in 2024. The award carries a citation. Applications must be submitted through the candidate's university with department endorsement.

5. REGISTRATION FEE EXEMPTION

ISAE will offer limited registration fee exemptions for Retired Life Members and Young Scholars attending the 85th Annual Conference (CCSHAU, Hisar, Nov 11–13, 2025). Preference will be given to life members. Final selection by a committee under the ISAE President.

6. TRAVEL GRANTS

The Society will provide travel grants to the young scholars to encourage them to participate in the 85th Annual Conference at Hisar. The details can be checked on the official ISAE website.

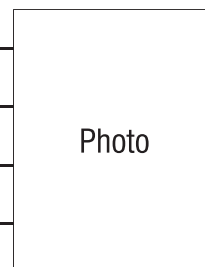
